On May 4, the library began offering contact free curbside pickup of books and DVDs while protecting staff and the community.

On May 18, the library began offering contact free document services to include faxing, copying, printing, and scanning.

HCCS continues to serve people as a drive-up service only until further notice and may be able to provide non-food assistance over the phone in some cases. Please call the office at 812-738-8143 if you have questions about eligibility. Our office is open Monday through Friday, 8:30 am - 4:30 pm.

Mobile Food Pantries - In conjunction with Dare to Care, HCCS holds two Mobile Food Pantries the 2nd Saturday of each month. Morning distribution begins at 10am at Unity Chapel United Methodist Church in Ramsey. Afternoon distribution begins at 2:00pm at the South Central School campus on Hwy 11 in Elizabeth. Mobile pantries will also operate as drive-thru with added precautions due to COVID-19. Clients are asked to stay in vehicles and your food box will be placed in your trunk. Participants must bring a photo ID. The next Mobile Food Pantries will be June 13, 2020.
