Letter from Steve Gilliland



May 6, 2019: Julie Moorman succeeds Steve Gilliland as HCCF President & CEO after his 20 years of service.

Building Dynamic Boards of Directors

Required training for board members of nonprofit organizations seeking grants from HCCF. Offered three times in 2019, there was no cost to participants upon completing the two-part training.

Dictionary Project

Designed to reach students as they transition from learning to read, to reading to learn. HCCF distributed 498 free copies of "Webster's Dictionary for Students: Special Encyclopedic Edition" by giving one to every third-grade student in the county.

Fundraisers Group

Free monthly meetings to learn fundraising best practices and share ideas. Topics included marketing, charitable gaming, nonprofit accounting, volunteer management, special event planning and more.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

Encourages a love of reading by providing preschool children a free age-appropriate book in the mail each month. In 2019, an average of 1,647 children received books each month and 19,762 books were mailed.

Step Ahead Council

Monthly gathering of representatives from nonprofits serving Harrison County to share information and find ways to collaborate.

HCCF Youth Philanthropy Council

Promotes youth development by providing experiences in philanthropy. YPC grants awarded: \$250 to the Boy Scouts of America to build kiosks at O'Bannon Woods State Park; \$1,200 to the Harrison County Youth Advocacy Center to cover start-up costs for Phoenix 4-H Club; \$1,500 to Hayswood Theatre for a two-week children's theatre camp, and \$1,600 to the Harrison Hoosiers 4-H Club to complete a beautification and conservation project at Hayswood Park.

Results From Fiber Internet Expansion

As a former HCCF board member, Linda Burnham knows the importance of the foundation having money that is not restricted to a particular program or project in order to be flexible enough to meet ever-changing community needs. But last year that importance became personal. Thanks to the expansion of high-speed internet into the Elizabeth area, Linda's son was able to begin telecommuting to work – in Atlanta, Georgia. Now Linda's son and his family have moved back to the area and Linda is thrilled to have them living close again.

The fiber internet expansion, which is one of the largest projects HCCF has ever participated in, continued in 2019. The multi-million-dollar project was funded by a \$3 million investment from HCCF, a \$2 million investment from county government and an initial \$10 million investment from Mainstream Fiber Networks (MSFN). The first goal was to place 115 miles of fiber optic cable "backbone" throughout the county. From this backbone, individual families and businesses would be able to access high-speed internet. At the end of 2019, 355 miles of cable had been placed.

The work is not over just because the initial goal is complete. MSFN is busy installing connections to homes and businesses, and the project partners are aware some areas of the county are still waiting for the opportunity. Work continues to secure easements and address geological issues.

Lilly Endowment Inc. Matching Gift Challenge

HCCF stands to bring nearly \$500,000 into our community from Lilly Endowment Inc. thanks to the GIFT VII Matching Gift Challenge.

Lilly Endowment Inc. is a private philanthropic foundation located in Indianapolis. The Endowment is offering a \$2 for \$1 match for all unrestricted gifts to HCCF.

Gifts to an HCCF unrestricted fund are not directed by the donor for a particular use but rather allow the foundation to use them to meet the needs of the community as they arise. This flexibility will help meet the needs seen now and ones to come in the future.

Donations to the HCCF General Builder's Fund and individually named Builder's Funds qualify for the two for one match until all the allocated money is used.

A new individually named Builder's Fund can be established with a minimum gift of \$2,500. That minimum gift will become a fund of \$7,500 with the match from Lilly Endowment Inc.

Builder's Funds' Impact

Each year since they have been established, Builder's Funds have provided funding for various community projects. The collective spendable from Builder's Funds provided \$31,750 for grants in 2019.

Repair Affair received \$1,500 to assist seniors and those with disabilities with home improvements.

A \$3,400 grant helped Louisville-based Fund for the Arts expand the Cultural Pass program into Harrison County.

Heavy spring rains forced Hayswood Theatre to seek a new roof sooner than expected. HCCF granted the organization \$3,400 from Builder's Funds.

Connie Bell, Treasure of Hayswood Theatre said, "For us to have such a need and for the community foundation to address that need so quickly is phenomenal."

The Harrison County Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition (HCSAPC) began renovating an existing structure in Corydon that will become Genesis House, a transitional living space for women overcoming substance abuse. HCSAPC received \$13,300 from Builder's Funds as well as an additional grant from HCCF to assist in the renovations.

Jeff Skaggs, Coordinator for HCSAPC, said, "The Genesis House will change lives for women in Harrison County. Thank you to HCCF for providing support in returning a mother, daughter, employee and community member back to their families by overcoming addiction."

Nature Trail Work Continues Thanks to Endowment Funding

Since 2017, Sycamore Land Trust (SLT) and Heth-Washington Elementary School have been working to create a nature trail on school grounds using money from the Sycamore Land Trust Conservation and Environmental Education Fund. The endowment fund was established at HCCF in 2009, and it has been used to monitor conservation easements and provide landowner workshops, as well as cover expenses related to clearing the trail and planting trees at the school. In April of 2019, Shane Gibson, SLT Environmental Education Director, instructed second-grade students on how to identify invasive plants and properly plant new trees.



HCCF Takes the Lead in Making Preschool Available with Two Programs.

Jump Start Preschool

The 2018-19 school year was the fifth year of a five-year pilot preschool program funded by HCCF called Jump Start. The goal of the program is to make quality preschool available to low-income 4-year-old children. Children enrolled in the program participate in free, full-day preschool provided at multiple sites throughout the county.



HCCF knows it is important for children to have high-quality educational experiences in their early years. By improving their reading, language, math, quantitative reasoning, social and emotional skills, these students will have a brighter future.

During the 2018-19 school year, 59 students were enrolled across 9 different preschools. In the pre-K Pilot Annual Evaluation Report, the Applied Research and Education Center at IU Southeast outlined that the children made substantial progress throughout the school year.

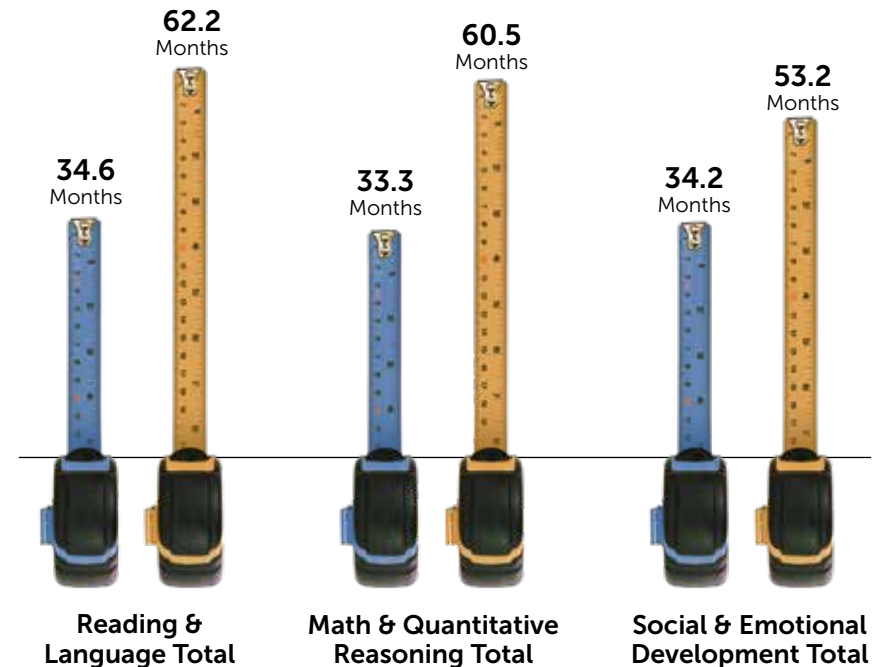
The students were given the ISTAR-KR assessment at the beginning, middle and end of the school year to measure progress. At the start of the year, the average student in Jump Start had development levels similar to a 3-year-old. By the end of the school year, the majority of students were at or nearly on par with their 5-year-old peers in reading & language, as well as math & quantitative reasoning. The students also increased their social and emotional development level by an average of 19 months in a period of only 9 months.

Success isn't always something that can be tangible and easily measured. One of the preschools shared stories of two students. One came from a home that was unstable and volatile. Another student struggled academically and, as a result, had a difficult time relating to classmates. Both students made significant progress socially as a result of the stable, secure and nurturing setting.

Because of the success in the pilot program, the HCCF Board of Directors made the decision to continue funding the program beyond pilot status.

On My Way Pre-K

The 2018-19 school year was the first year Harrison County 4-year-olds could benefit from On My Way Pre-K (OMWPK), a program funded by the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration. Similar to Jump Start in funding full-day preschool, during that school year, OMWPK supported children who were living in households at or below 127 percent of the Federal Poverty Level and had parents/guardians who were working or attending school. OMWPK also provided 53 weeks of free child care.

HCCF served as the "lead" for the state program in Harrison County. Families who did not qualify for OMWPK were then encouraged to apply for Jump Start funding.

Scholarships

In 2019, HCCF awarded 251 scholarships to graduating high school and adult students totaling \$738,117.

Stellar Updates

In 2016, HCCF made a \$1 million a year commitment for four years to the Stellar Communities Program. The multi-agency partnership has leveraged \$26 million from various sources toward community development in the Town of Corydon. Several HCCF-supported projects were completed in 2019.

Corydon Senior Lofts, located at the site of the former Corydon Junior High School and the Gerdon Youth Center, opened in February. The lofts have 45 residential units: 23 two-bedroom units, 18 one-bedroom units and four studio apartments. The lofts were designed to be convenient places for senior citizens to live, with proximity to downtown businesses and attractions.

The Indian Creek Trail extension, connecting Hayswood Park to downtown Corydon, also opened in February 2019. The popular trail is used year round.

The downstairs portion of the historic J.J. Bulleit Building was completed at the end of 2019. A restaurant and other commercial spaces were opened.

Five downtown businesses received support from the Façade Improvement Program in 2019, bringing the total number of businesses that have benefited from the program to 27.

The Town of Corydon announced plans to redevelop Rice Island as one of the final Stellar projects. The former park, which is located near the Corydon Senior Lofts, will become a park again with trails, restrooms and a remodeled amphitheater.
