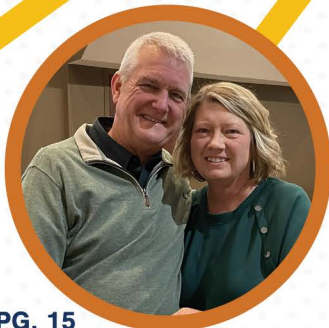

# CONNECTING THE DOTS



## ***Partnership with Town Planning Initiative moving forward.***

Harrison County Community Foundation (HCCF) continued their community leadership work in coordinating the Town Planning Initiative. This project was funded

by Lilly Endowment Inc. through their GIFT VII (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow) initiative and additional funding support provided by HCCF. The Town Planning Initiative provides the opportunity for all ten (10) incorporated towns to create or update a Comprehensive Plan and an Asset Management Plan. HCCF saw this as an opportunity to provide towns the resources and support to plan for the future of their towns. The hope is the town plans could be the grassroots effort to be incorporated into a future county-wide Comprehensive Plan.

HCCF has worked in partnership with consultants, Jill Saegesser (The Wheatley Group) and Amy Williams (Taylor Siefker Williams Design Group) on this project. During 2023 the first round of towns (Town of Lanesville, Town of New Middletown, and Town of Laconia) completed their town planning and each town had their Comprehensive Plans adopted by both the Harrison County Plan Commission and the Harrison County Commissioners.

The second round of towns (Town of Palmyra, Town of New Amsterdam, Town of Mauckport, and Town of Corydon) continued in their planning in 2023. Both Palmyra and Mauckport had their plans adopted by the Harrison County Plan Commission and the Harrison County Commissioners.

Unlike all the other incorporated towns in Harrison County, the Town of Corydon governs its own planning and zoning and therefore their plan only needed approval by the Corydon Plan Commission and Corydon Town Council which occurred in September of 2023.

The last round of towns (Town of Elizabeth, Town of Milltown, and Town of Crandall) began the planning process with Community Conversations in 2023. At these conversations, consultants introduced the planning process, explained the resources available, answered questions and guided the towns on the first steps in the process.

Multiple towns worked on the development of their Pavement Asset Management Plans (PAMP) which is required in order for towns to be eligible for the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) Community Crossing Matching Grant (CCMG) program. This program leverages local funds to secure INDOT grant funds to maintain local roads and streets.

# GIFT VII - BUILDER'S FUNDS

We are celebrating ten years since the Foundation started Builder's Funds, which assist with funding projects in our community and provide community members with another tool to make a difference. Like other endowment funds, a Builder's Fund begins with an initial gift placed in a set-aside fund held by the Foundation. The original and following gifts are invested to generate additional, ongoing support forever.

For other types of endowment funds, a designated purpose, whether a nonprofit, field of interest, or cause, is chosen. For Builder's Funds, however, donated funds are not designated to a specific purpose, allowing the HCCF Board of Directors to approve funds for the most pressing community needs as they arise alongside other grant funding.

Builder's Funds are for everyone. Any individual, family, or business can start a Builder's Fund. Currently, there are fifty Builder's Funds established by individuals, families, as well as businesses of varying sizes.

The ultimate benefit of starting a Builder's Fund is impacting the community for generations to come. A fund can be created in your name or in honor or memory of a loved one or someone who has made a significant impact on your life.

We are excited to offer a special 3:1 matching opportunity announced in the fall of 2023 through Lilly Endowment Inc. With this match, Lilly Endowment is offering a 2:1 match, and with the Foundation's current 1:1 match, it's a 3:1 match! For example, if you donate \$2,500 to establish a new Builder's Fund, that gift becomes \$10,000. This is an opportunity for

donor's dollars to go even further and is available until the end of 2025 or until the fundraising goal is met.

One does not have to establish a fund to participate in the 3:1 matching opportunity.

You can give to an existing Builder's Fund with whom you have an existing connection, or you can give to the Harrison County Community Foundation Builder's Fund, which is our catchall Builder's Fund for any gift not designated to a specific fund or purpose. With this fund, there is no minimum for how much to give, and you can still take advantage of the matching gift by tripling your donation and impact.

When looking at the impact of Builder's Funds, we are witnessing the result of a collective effort. At present, the total raised in Builder's Funds exceeds \$1.5 million, with five percent of this amount accessible for spending at any given time. Since Builder's Funds' inception, the Foundation has allocated \$180,000 from them to support fourteen projects. Builder's Fund have been used for a multitude of different purposes over the last decade, including the Harrison County Fairgrounds Grandstand, Veteran's Housing for homeless and at-risk homeless Veterans, and Possibility Playground at Hayswood Park.



# KEY COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

## 21st Century Scholars:

In 2015, HCCF launched an incentive program to encourage the three Harrison County school corporations to take an active role in encouraging families to enroll in the 21st Century Scholars program. 21st Century Scholars is a state program designed to help ensure eligible Hoosier students can afford the opportunity provided by a college education. If a student meets income eligibility requirements and applies by June 30th of their eighth-grade year, they could be eligible for 100% free tuition for up to four years of college. Funds are awarded to the schools based on the percentage of eligible eighth-grade students who successfully enroll in the 21st Century Scholars program. For the 2022-23 school year, HCCF awarded \$43,448 cumulatively in support of this initiative.

## Dictionary Project:

Each year, all third-grade students, as well as each school library and third-grade classroom in Harrison County, are provided with a free dictionary. This initiative is part of HCCF's wider focus of assisting in the education of all ages. In 2023, 557 dictionaries were distributed. Since its inception, over 8,000 dictionaries have been distributed.

## Dolly Parton's Imagination Library: (DPIL)



DPIL encourages a love of reading by providing children with a free age-appropriate book in the mail each month up until their fifth birthday. HCCF began sponsoring this program for Harrison County children in 2008 and, since then has distributed nearly 300,000 books. Approximately 1,500 participants received a book as part of DPIL in 2023, with over 449 new sign-ups.

## Jump Start Preschool:

Jump Start is a program supporting affordable, high-quality preschool education for eligible families in Harrison County. Six providers participated in the program in 2023. HCCF provided \$136,173 in support for preschool services in 2023. Since its inception in 2014-2015, Jump Start has funded 712 students through May 2023, and HCCF has funded \$3,302,904 for preschool services.



## Youth Philanthropy Council (YPC):

YPC is an opportunity for teens to learn about philanthropy and nonprofits as well as make grant recommendations on YPC grants. A group of local high school students review submitted YPC grant applications, discuss the merit of each grant application, and come to a consensus on their grant recommendations. HCCF partners with Leadership Harrison County (LHC) for YPC to be a part of the LHC Youth program, which involves young leaders from all Harrison County high schools. In 2023, YPC awarded St. Joseph Catholic School \$2,000 for a greenhouse and garden supplies, Corydon Central Vanguard \$925 for percussion equipment, Lanesville High School \$625 to support After Prom, Blue River All-Stars 4-H \$1,500 for Blankets for Veterans project, and Blue River All-Stars 4-H \$500 for Carnival for Cancer supplies.

# NONPROFIT SUSTAINABILITY

HCCF is committed to helping local nonprofit organizations increase their ability to perform their much-needed services. In addition to providing funds from unrestricted dollars and growing agency-designated endowment funds, the Foundation provides several nonprofit sustainability offerings.

## **Board Governance Training:**

The training includes nonprofit basics and explains the need for board governance, the seven functions of a nonprofit board, leadership, management, and governance and the role of the board, fiduciary and legal responsibilities, strategic planning, board structure, and function, fundraising as board members, and best practices. It is a blend of presentations, case studies, and discussions. The training is face-to-face, and participants must complete the 6-hour program for certification of completion. The training session costs \$100, but refunded after successful completion.

## **Fundraisers Group:**

The Fundraisers Group began meeting in 2018 to provide aid and support to any nonprofit agency board member, volunteer, or staff tasked with fundraising. The brown bag lunch and learn sessions are held the first Wednesday of every other month at noon. Participation is free to nonprofits located in or providing services in Harrison County. Ninety-three participants from 43 nonprofit organizations participated in the Fundraisers Group throughout the year. Presentations have included topics such as Giving Tuesday, year-end campaigns, and creating an annual development plan.

## **Step Ahead Council:**

The Step Ahead Council is a monthly gathering of representatives from nonprofits located in or serving Harrison County. The free meeting is offered on the third Thursday at noon, with a different nonprofit highlighted to share information and find ways to collaborate. In 2023, 60 representatives from 38 agencies participated in Step Ahead throughout the year. Presenters at monthly meetings included LifeSpring Health Systems, Lincoln Hills Head Start, Harrison County Health Department, United Healthcare, Genesis House, Ronald McDonald House, United Community/Metro United Way, Comfort House, Purdue Extension, and the Veterans Services Office.

## **Nonprofit Growth Series:**

The Nonprofit Growth Series was created in 2022 as a series of workshops to help local nonprofits achieve sustainability. Offered once a quarter, these workshops are free to nonprofits located in or providing services in Harrison County. Workshops have included Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, grant writing, and collaborations.

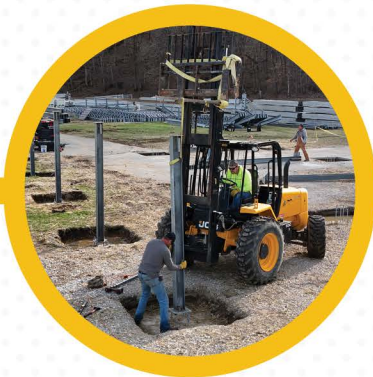
# COMMUNITY PARTNERS CONNECT THE DOTS FOR REPLACEMENT GRANDSTAND AT FAIRGROUNDS



Harrison County Community Foundation (HCCF) awarded the Harrison County Agricultural Society (HCAS) a \$1.65 million grant in February 2023 to support a replacement grandstand at the Harrison County Fairgrounds. HCAS, an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, owns the fairgrounds, which hosts the annual Harrison County Fair—the oldest county fair in Indiana to be continuously held in the same location. The grandstand project was a collaborative effort involving multiple partners, including the Town of Corydon, the Indiana State Fair Grant Committee for Harness Racing, the Harrison County Government as well as, HCCF and HCAS.

The original 2,700-seat grandstand, which was deemed unsafe and economically unfeasible to renovate after almost a century of use (61 of those years in Harrison County), were removed in December 2022. The funding secured for the project enabled the purchase and erection of a repurposed grandstand from Memphis, Tennessee. The new grandstand boasts an increased capacity of 4,700 seats, backed seating, a new roof, and accessibility accommodations.

HCAS commenced the construction with a groundbreaking ceremony held on November 14, 2023 at the site of the replacement grandstand. HCAS invited community leaders, business owners, families, and individuals to the special occasion. During the groundbreaking event, attendees heard from several notable speakers: HCAS Board Chair Tim Harmon, HCCF President & CEO Julie Moorman, Harrison County Commissioners President Nelson Stepro, Harrison County Councilman Kyle Nix, and current 4-H student Isabelle Abner. Their remarks highlighted the significance of the project and the collaborative efforts that brought it to fruition. Completion of the replacement grandstand is expected in 2024.



# WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

NEW FUNDS ARE INDICATED IN BOLD

An endowment fund starts with a gift of cash, assets, or other property donated to the Foundation converted to cash (if it isn't already) and deposited into a set-aside fund. With this fund, the amount of the original gift and principal is never touched, but it is invested in perpetuity to earn additional support for the established purpose of the fund, whether a nonprofit or cause.

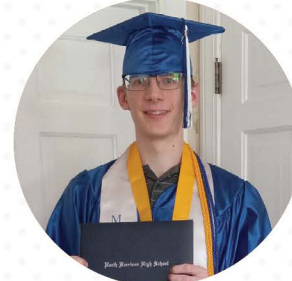
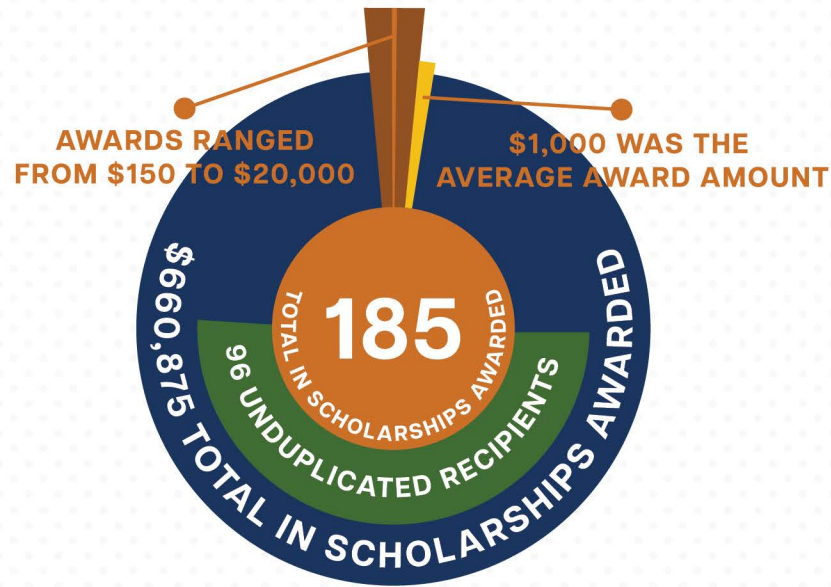
# BUILDER'S FUNDS

Buffalo Trace is the name of Indiana's section of an ancient footpath that stretched from the Carolinas to the Pacific. Like a ribbon, it tied together elements of human history, starting with the pre-Colombian era and lasting through the 1800s.

This major thoroughfare carried ancient peoples, American Bison or "buffalo", Native Americans, explorers, soldiers, and eventually European settlers from the Falls of the Ohio to Vincennes and destinations beyond. It is still relevant today as U.S. Highway 150 roughly parallels the same path.<sup>1</sup>

Here at the Harrison County Community Foundation the Trace Society recognizes those who leave a gift through their will, trust, insurance, or other estate arrangement. Members of the Trace Society will also remain relevant as their gifts will have a lasting impact for generations to come, opening pathways for others to use.

Trace Society members may choose to designate their gift for a specific purpose or endowment fund, a particular field of interest, or leave it unrestricted so that the HCCF Board of Directors may apply it to the area of greatest need.

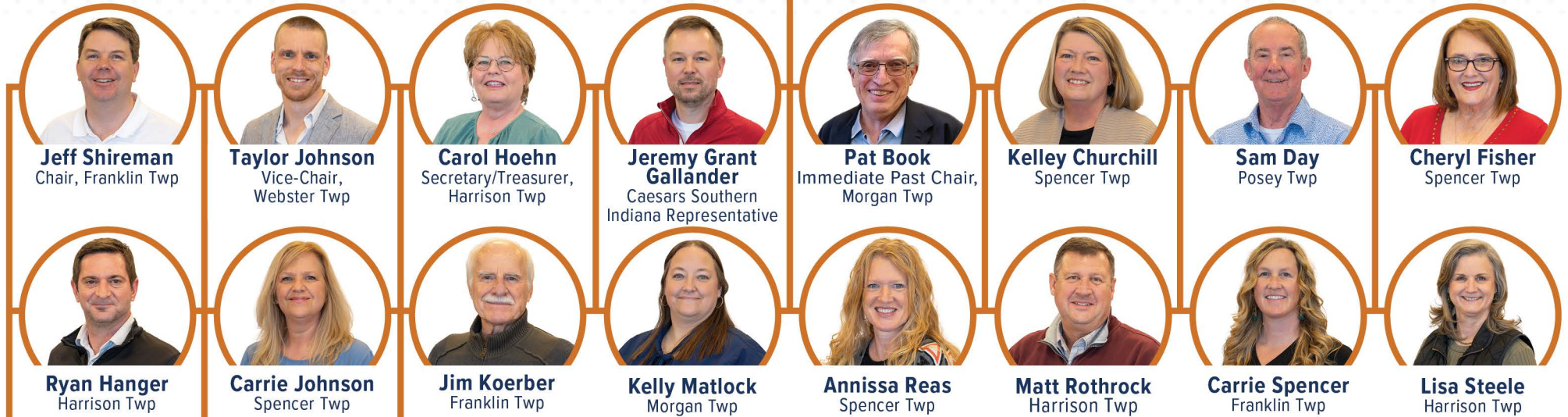

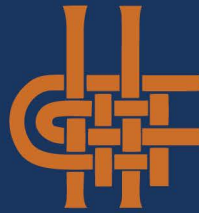
